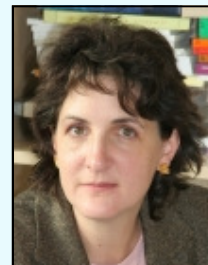


1ST SECTION

EU CONSTRUCTION AND COMMUNITY POLICIES

Nathalie Tousignant

She studied at University of Laval (Canada) and Catholic University of Louvain (Belgium). She is a fully-fledged professor of contemporary history at the “Facultés universitaires Saint-Louis” (Brussels, Belgium). Her teaching activities deal with history of western civilization, history of international relations with a focus on geopolitics and European integration. Her research activities address post-colonial studies and visual anthropology in Central Africa, mainly Congo and Ruanda.



Melchior Wathelet

He obtained degrees in Law (1972) and Political Science (1974) at the University of Liège and Master of Laws at the Harvard University (1976). He was Member of the Belgian House of Representatives (1977-1995), Member of the Walloon Government (1980-1985), Minister-President of the Walloon Region (1985-1988), Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Justice (1988-1992), Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Justice and Economic Affairs (1992-1995), Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defense (1995). From 1995 to 2003 he was a Judge at the Court of Justice of the European Communities.



Since 1985 he is Professor of Law at the Catholic University of Louvain and since 2004 - Professor of European Law at the University of Liège. He is also Professor invited by different universities (France, Austria, Germany, Luxembourg, USA). Since 2005 he is Of-counsel at the firm of law “CMS - Bureau Francis Lefebvre” (Neuilly-sur-Seine – Paris) and since 2007 lawyer (Bar - Hauts de Seine).

François van der Mensbrugge

He studied Law and Economics in France (Aix-en-Provence and Paris), Belgium (Louvain-la-Neuve) and in the U.K. (London School of Economics). He served as an attorney at the Paris bar (France) for several years. He was Visiting Scholar at the Columbia University, New York, in 1993 and at the Georgetown University Law Center, Washington D.C., in 1998.



He served as an expert at the European Commission in the mid-1990s, working in DG XIII (Telecommunications, Information Market and Exploitation of Research). After serving at the European Commission, he returned to the academic world and completed a doctoral dissertation on the concept of “universal service”, taken from a Comparative Law perspective (EU/USA).

He is currently working as Professor of Law at the Law Faculties of the University of Saint-Louis (Brussels), and the University of Liège. Courses taught: EU Law, Common Law, and Comparative Law.

Julien De Beys

He is a visiting Professor at the Institute of European Studies at the Catholic University of Louvain (UCL). He is responsible for lessons related to Internal Market Law and also a legal counsellor at the Belgian Federal Parliament (CdH) on European topics. In April 2008, he presented with success his PhD entitled “European State Aid Law and General Interest”. He wrote numerous publications mixing Public Economic Law and Competition Law. He is also a regular trainer for the European institutions on several topics of European Institution Law.



Raoul Delcorde

He is a Belgian diplomat and a professor of European studies. He is presently deputy director general for political affairs at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Brussels. He is also a guest professor at the Institute of European Studies at the Catholic University of Louvain (UCL). Ambassador Delcorde gives a course on the common foreign and security policy to post graduate students. He has been posted to US and Europe and was Belgian Ambassador to Sweden from 2003 to 2007. He is the author of several books and of about 35 articles.

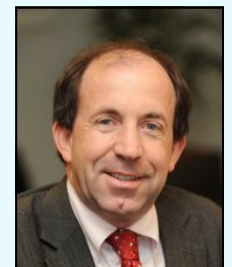


Ilkka Saarilahti
